CODE OF CONDUCT POLICY: GENESEE BOARD MEMBERS

1. Policy Accountable Owner and Identifier Key Word(s):

- a. The Code of Conduct policy owner is the Genesee board (BOD).
- b. Key words for the Code of Conduct policy are:
 - i. Code of conduct
 - ii. Board members' behavior
 - iii. Board members will
 - iv. Board members will not
- 2. Policy Name: Code of Conduct.
- **3. Purpose for policy:** This policy is intended to inform board members, potential board members, and community members about acceptable and unacceptable behavior for board members.
- 4. Policy details and specialized content if any:
 - The Genesee Code of Conduct is modeled after the Community Association Institute's Model Code of Ethics.
 - b. The Code of Conduct Form must be signed by all Genesee Foundation board members annually immediately after the annual November elections.
 - c. The Code of Conduct Form reads as follows:

"Code of Conduct Form: Genesee Board Members

A board position at the Genesee Foundation is a leadership position of trust, responsibility, and service to the greater community. It is meant to enhance the long-term tangible and intangible assets of the community, as well as the quality and safety of life envisioned for members and residents.

Board members will:

- 1. Strive at all times to serve the best interests of the community as a whole.
- 2. Use sound judgment to make the best possible decisions for the community, considering all reasonably available information, circumstances, and resources.
- 3. Perform their duties diligently, acting within their authority as defined by law and the governing documents, policies, and procedures of the Foundation, the board, and the Architectural Review Committee.
- 4. Provide opportunities for residents to comment on decisions before those decisions are finalized.
- 5. Perform their duties without bias.
- 6. Conduct open, fair, and well-publicized elections.
- 7. Reaffirm their understanding of these principles by re-signing the Code of Conduct each year at or before the first board meeting after the annual members' meeting.
- 8. Support all duly adopted board decisions, even if the board member was in the minority regarding actions that did not obtain unanimous consent. This shall not preclude a board member from publishing the reasons for his/her dissent in a respectful and orderly fashion which does not undermine the integrity or credibility of the board or any of its members.

Board members will not:

- 1. Reveal to others confidential information unless specifically authorized by the board or required by law.
- 2. Make promises not authorized by the board, or exercise authority as a board member, except when acting as an official member of the board, or as authorized by the board.
- Advocate or support any action that violates a law or regulatory requirement.
- 4. Use their positions or authority for personal gain or to seek advantage for any friends or relatives over another member or resident.
- 5. Spend unauthorized association funds for their own personal use or benefit, or the benefit of friends or relatives.
- 6. Accept any gifts—directly or indirectly—worth \$50 or more from owners or residents when matters concerning them are being considered, or from contractors or suppliers.

- 7. Knowingly misrepresent facts in any issue involving community business.
- 8. Divulge confidential, personal information about any association owner, resident, or employee that was obtained in the performance of board duties.
- 9. Make personal attacks on colleagues, staff, or residents.
- 10. Harass, threaten, or attempt through any means to control or instill fear in any board member, owner, resident, employee, or contractor.
- 11. Reveal to any owner, resident, or third party, including spouses, significant others, or family members, the discussions or decisions made at any board meeting properly held in executive session.
